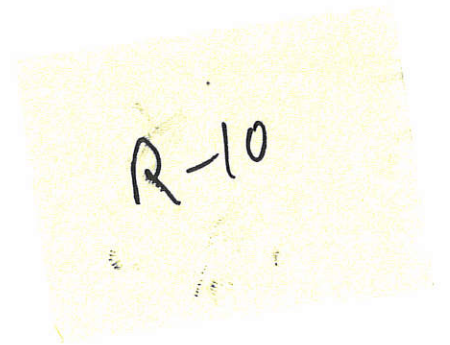

Greetings to all,

I am Kevin Cuttill, President of Crusaders for Veterans Inc, and have been contacted by a veteran in need of some assistance. It is clear to me that this situation and that of many others (to include some who have died) have fallen on deaf ears and/or lost within channels of either failed policies or lack of such policies that I believe needs to be addressed at the earliest possible time for all who hold office to address this case and possibly come to a positive resolve that will SAVE LIVES of those serving under your commands.

First off, our organization is NOT handling any form of legal status/claims or lawsuits; however, I am handling this case with the greatest of intent to secure every avenue of resolve at the lowest level which is generally the fastest route and with lives at stake I strongly believe the quicker the better.

I must say that I wish our meeting would be under a far better condition; but, I do look forward to meeting each of you to speak of a hazardous and life threatening situation.

January 24<sup>th</sup> is my optimal day; however, with so many individuals and schedules involved here I will leave the meeting date, time and place as your responsibility. I cannot stress enough of the importance to establish this meeting as soon as possible for the sake of those in harms way.

I am fully aware that this letter contains a list of some very busy individuals; therefore, if for reasons unavoidable some cannot make this meeting I request you send a representative that is knowledgeable and has authority to help either explain or account for actions either performed or failed by your sections. I would prefer being able to discuss with all parties in front of one another at the onset and possibly break down to smaller meetings as we progress with this case so policies/procedures and resolve can become a reality to benefit everyone.

It is apparent, via the two binders I am in possession of that hold documentation of hazardous material inspections, occupational health issues, safety failures, AF policy failures (AFM 91-224 & Executive Order 12196) and a Suspected Cancer Cluster report dated January 26, 2017, that lives of veterans, active duty military and civilian employees on Keesler Air Force Base have been detrimental. Again, I am not working to strengthen a lawsuit – that is in the hands of those affected – Our intent at this time is to make our client whole and to prevent future liabilities for our young new recruits.

Though you are under no obligation to make this meeting happen, I believe, this route would be more beneficial for all. Please respond by January 16<sup>th</sup>; otherwise, I will assume you are not interested in this avenue and I will proceed with our next strategy.
